2 STUDENT ORGANIZATION. BE IT ENACTED BY THE SENATE OF THE ASSOCIATED STUDENTS OF NEW

6 To provide funding for one student (1 female) to present at the 26th IPRA General Conference in Freetown, Sierra

30 Johanna Esquivel, a doctoral student in the Curriculum & Instruction department with concentration in
31 Language, Literacy and Culture. They will attend the International Peace Research Association (IPRA) in
32 Freetown, Sierra Leone—November 27-December 1, 2016, and present their paper "Scaffolding Peace,
33 Identity, and Language with Elementary Bilingual Students: A Critical Examination of Media Stereotypes
34 and World Children's Literature." Participating and presenting in this international conference will provide
35 them with the opportunity to critically examine and understand language or linguistic practices from a
36 global perspective. Language is not merely a linguistic tool employed for communicative purposes, but it

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is a way in which situated identities, discourses, genres, and ideological frameworks of power are produced and reproduced.
