**AN ACT**

1 MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE ACCOUNT OF REFORMED UNIVERSITY FELLOWSHIP. BE IT  
2 ENACTED BY THE SENATE OF THE ASSOCIATED STUDENTS OF NEW MEXICO STATE UNIVERSITY.

5 To provide funding for four students (2 males, 2 females) to attend the Reformed University Fellowship Conference  
6 in Laguna Beach, FL, from May 13 - 21, 2017.

25 One thousand fifty-nine dollars and no cents (\$1059.00) shall be appropriated to the account of Reformed University  
26 Fellowship from the ASNMSU Surplus Account.

29 Victoria Smith, Sarah Pitassi, Daniel Wong, Royce Main joined over 1,200 students from other university  
30 campuses from across the nation for a week of theological education and program development around the  
31 Panama City Beach, FL area. The conference serves as an opportunity for NMSU students to grow in their  
32 spiritual knowledge and understanding through first-rate teaching and also provides an ideal space for  
33 NMSU students to build relationships with one another that will grow and endure throughout the rest of  
34 their time at NMSU.
