58 Section 4: Rationale.

59 Subsection A: Shannon Cowell is requesting funding to present at the SHA 2018 in New Orleans, LA from January
60 3 – 6, 2018. The Society for Historical Archaeology (SHA) is the largest professional organization of historical
61 archaeologists. Their presentation addresses intra-site spatial analysis of a colonial Spanish campsite on the Camino
62 Real del Tierra Adentro in New Mexico. The research breaks new ground in applying small-scale spatial analysis to
63 a historic trail campsite, a site class often overlooked in favor of prehistoric campsites or architectural Spanish
64 colonial sites.

66 Subsection B: Shannon Cowell is requesting funding to conduct research at the University of Michigan's Museum of
67 Anthropological Archaeology in Ann Arbor, MI from January 21-27, 2018, for their master's thesis. They will be
68 conducting compositional analysis on a ceramic collection. Upon completion, this research will refine micaceous
69 ceramic typologies in eastern New Mexico, allowing for more accurate chronological assessments of archaeological
70 sites based on the presence of temporally diagnostic ceramics.
