18 Section 3: Appropriation.

19 Three thousand five hundred dollars and no cents (\$3500.00) shall be appropriated to the account of Engineering  
20 Student Council from the ASNMSU Surplus Account.

22 Section 4: Rationale.

23 The Engineering Council has appropriated all the designated budget to student organizations. There are  
24 currently twenty student organizations part of the Engineering Council that are eligible to request two  
25 hundred fifty dollars (\$250) or five hundred dollars (\$500) in appropriations. The Council has no more  
26 funds to appropriate and thus is requesting an additional funding of \$3500 to be able to fund the student  
27 organizations.
