

27 Four hundred eighty-two dollars and no cents (\$482.00) shall be appropriated to the account of Model United
28 Nations from the ASNMSU Surplus Account.

30 Section 4: Rationale.

31 Jessica Abigail Venegas travelled to Cusco, Peru for four weeks to volunteer in a psychological counseling program
32 for disadvantaged youth. While there, they worked alongside a local psychologist in an orphanage and assisted in
33 individual and group therapy sessions. They also planned and lead workshops and various activities for the orphans.
34 The entirety of the program was conducted in Spanish. Aggies Go Global assisted with the airfare for this trip.
